The top four places remain unchanged with all four entries producing a blank in the last 14 days. The big movers were Kathy Tuggey and Roberta Tweedy, who both improved their positions by 4 places following the victory of Trawlerman.

There is only 50 points separating the top 14 entries with only a month and a half remaining in the competition. This could well be the closest finish we have had in recent times.

The three winners in this update are commented on below:-

The John and Thady Gosden trained, <u>Trawlerman</u> (14 selections), again demonstrated his superiority in staying races, with victory over stablemate Sweet William (also in the competition) in the Group 2 Lonsdale Cup at York. This was a good performance because he had to incur a 3lb penalty for his Gold Cup win. This sets up an intriguing finale to the competition, because his final race this season will probably be the Group 1 Long Distance Cup on the final day of the competition.

<u>Sky Majesty</u> (11 selections) lived up to her speedy pedigree (Blue Point-Majestic Alexander) taking the Group 3 Ballyogan at Naas. The filly's trainer, William Haggas, is considering supplementing her for the Group 1 Sprint Cup at Haydock in September.

The Frankel filly, <u>Red Letter</u> (17 selections) continues on the upgrade, and duly followed up her listed stakes victory at Killarney, with an authoritative victory in the Group 3 Snow Fairy at the Curragh. Ger Lyons is bringing the Juddmonte filly along nicely and could return to the Curragh for the Blandford in a couple of weeks time. Mike Nibblett and Roger Beveridge have both napped the filly who could well develop into a very interesting four year old next season.
